Chairman's Comments



I have been involved with the Bolton Hindu Forum (a registered charity) for the last year and I have recently taken over the role of Chairman of the Board of Trustees. My background is in the field of "Discovery of New Medicines". Working for AstraZeneca, I have discovered a medicine called "Zoladex" which is used for the treatment of patients with Prostate cancer, Breast Cancer and some other non-malignant conditions.

The medicine is currently available all over the world and is prescribed to millions of patients. For this discovery I was awarded the Society of Drug Research Award which is awarded once every two

years for the discovery that has made significant impact on the human health.

In my role as a Chairman, I have quickly realised the important role that Bolton Hindu Forum is playing in the Bolton Community for a number of years. The Forum is involved in helping the community in various different ways. For example, with recent Covid-19 problems, the Forum management took an active role in helping the elderly with their shopping and providing a hot meal tiffin delivery service. The Forum has also been active in proving help with Hindu funeral services.

In addition to helping the community, the Forum is active in arranging cultural events. These events have been instrumental in enhancing the image of the community and actively promoting community cohesion. Last year the Forum organised two of the biggest cultural events in Bolton Town Hall. The events were attended by all the different communities. At our Diwali event, the Victoria Square in Bolton (in front of the Town Hall) was packed with people from different communities.

The Forum has recently launched a BHF Radio station. The station is being listened to not just in Bolton, but by the whole Hindu community nationally. In the last three months the station has had over half a million listeners.

In my five years of heading the Forum I have made a complete transformation:

- We re-visited and reformed the Constitution to introduce recruitment process for executive posts.
- · We have implemented and adopted Office 365 platform.
- We have made many friends connecting with the wider community.
- We organised two of our biggest events in Bolton Town Centre.
- · One Navratri Festival and Diwali on the Square.
- · We successfully registered and became a charity.
- We have moved our office in to bigger premises in the Town Centre.
- · We have set up a Funeral Service.
- · We are helping our elderly with their shopping.
- We are starting a hot meal tiffin delivery Service for the Elderly.
- · And now we have our Radio Station which is giving us national recognition.

The pandemic has turned all our lives upside down and we're all having to figure out new ways of working. Fortunately, our investment in Office 365 made it much easier for us to swich working from home. We were quick in adopting and using technology to reach out to our members virtually.

We started regular podcasts on our Facebook to keep our members engaged which they did in numbers. This became a daily regular broadcast covering variety of topics. We started an online radio station BHF Radio Station has become an instant Hit, not just in community in Bolton. It is listened to by the Whole Hindu Community Nationally. In just 5 months, we have been broadcasting we have had over 700 thousand listeners. Listeners are growing at pace and we can see the station becoming the most listened to station before long.

We are now looking forward working towards developing and implementing management structures to run the Charity professionally.

A Chief Executive post has been created to have the overall responsibility and run the organisation which I have been appointed to an initial 12 month's period. I have subsequently resigned from role of being a Trustee. I am pleased to announce Dr Anand Dutta has taken over the role of Chairman.
